WHAT IS A TRADE UNION?

Trade unions are democratic organisations of workers who come together to protect and advance our interests in the workplace.

Trade unions negotiate with employers, the government, or any other organisation that control or influence our pay and conditions at work.

Trade unions provide support and solidarity to our members in times of need.

Trade unions are independent of employers, the government and political parties.

Trade unions stand up for equality and against all discrimination, whether based on gender, ethnic origin, religion, age or disability.

WHY WE NEED TRADE UNIONS IN THE MATATU INDUSTRY

Most of us working in the matatu industry face big problems:

- Low pay
- Long hours
- Insecurity
- Frequent harassment from police and authorities
- Exploitation by vehicle owners
- Terrible working conditions
- Sickness and injury
- Lack of social protection

By coming together in a trade union, we are a powerful voice for change. We are stronger together than we are on our own.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF JOINING A TRADE UNION?

• Respect for our rights and improvements to our pay and working conditions.

 When we demand improvements together, we have a strong voice that cannot be ignored.

 Trade unions help us support one another when we face unfairness or ill-treatment.

 Trade unions campaign for social protection for all.

If we demand improvements on our own, we rarely get listened to. But together we have collective strength.

According to international and Kenyan law, all matatu workers have the right to be a member of a trade union of their choice.



WHO OWN AND GOVERN TRADE UNIONS?

As members, we have the right to attend regular meetings to elect our leaders, determine what needs to be done, and how we are going to achieve it.

All members regularly contribute a small amount of money to support the activities of the union. We have an equal say in how the money is to be used.
